



Laser Therapy and Arthritis



It has been shown to be very effective in assisting animals with arthritis, degenerative joint disease, or secondary soft tissue soreness associated with these conditions and can be performed in conjunction with NSAID medications.

What are the signs that my pet can benefit from Laser Therapy?

Many of our laser therapy patients are older animals with musculoskeletal ailments. Some signs that your senior companion is experiencing pain or discomfort are:

- Abnormal sitting or lying posture
- Circling multiple times before lying down
- Restlessness
- Whining, groaning or other vocalizations
- Limping, unable to get up or lie down
- Difficulty getting into car or down stairs
- Lack of grooming
- Won't wag tail
- Licking or biting area
- Lack of appetite
- Trembling

Ask your veterinarian to see if laser therapy can be added to your pet's plan of care.
