April is Heartworm

DID YOU KNOW that you can text us at our hospital phone number?? (925) 447-1420

Heartworms are foot long worms that infest the lungs, heart & blood vessels of our pets. They can cause major damage to organ systems including failure. These nasty parasites are spread from mammal to mammal and transmitted as larvae by mosquitoes.

A question we get often is "why do I have to test for Heartworm if my pet has been taking her HeartGard?". The short answer is that though Heartworm prevention is effective, nothing is 100% – this is the same concept as sunscreen. Heartworms can live for up to 7 years in dogs & 3 years in cats.
